What is a Worldview?



A set of beliefs (expressed as a story or propositions) on which we live and have our being.

What is a Worldview?



The presuppositions on which we make decisions and live our life.

What is a Worldview? (Long Definition)

A commitment of the heart that can be expressed as a story or in a set of propositions, which we believe about the basics of reality and are the foundation on which we live and have our being.

Life's Questions



- Where did we come from?
- Why are we here?
- Where are we going?
- How do we know right and wrong (good and evil)?
- What is the meaning of human history

1. Pluralization

All beliefs have equal validity.

It doesn't matter what you believe as long as you believe it.

2. Secularization

Faith beliefs are irrelevant.

It doesn't matter what you believe.

3. Privatization

Keep your faith beliefs and practices only in certain places (Church, Home, Christian School).

Ignore your beliefs everywhere else.

4. Compartmentalization

God (faith) speaks in areas of theology and ethics.

Humanity speaks everywhere else.

If there is a conflict between the two, Humanity's view should prevail.



 God is infinite and personal (triune), transcendent and immanent, omniscient, sovereign and good.



2. God created the cosmos ex nihilo to operate with a uniformity of cause and effect in an open system.



3. Human beings are created in the image of God and thus possess personality, personal responsibility, intelligence, morality, community, social capacity and creativity.



4. Human beings can know both the world around them and God himself because God has built into them the capacity to do so and because he takes an active role in communicating with them.



5. Human beings were created good, but through the Fall the image of God became defaced, though not so ruined as not to be capable of restoration; through the work of Christ, God redeemed humanity and began the process of restoring people to goodness, though any given person may choose to reject that redemption.




6. For each person death is either the gate to life with God and his people or the gate to eternal separation from the only thing that will ultimately fulfill human aspirations.



7. Ethics is transcendent and is based on the character of God as good (holy and loving).
