#### **MONTHLY MEMORY VERSE**

For God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life. (**John 3:16**)

#### TRIUMPHAL ENTRY

(Matthew 21:1-11)

Week 1

Brite Idea: Jesus is King.

He Question: What makes Jesus the King?

Jesus doesn't just rule over the Earth but over God's kingdom. He has authority over everything. One day every knee will bow down to Him. We Question: Since Jesus is King, how does that change things for us?

We can have a personal relationship with the King of Kings. Since He has all authority, we can trust Him for salvation, worship Him with our lives, and seek to follow His ways.

## JESUS WASHES THE DISCIPLES' FEET (John 13:1-17)

Week 2

Brite Idea: Jesus came to serve.

He Question: Why would Jesus serve others?

Jesus was a Servant-King. Even though He deserved to be served, He chose to serve others. He lived a life of love and sacrifice, putting others before Himself. We Question: Why should we serve others?

... Jesus told us to follow His example. He was the greatest of all, yet chose to serve. We can honor Him by serving others as well.

#### GARDEN OF GETHSEMANE

(Matthew 26:36-58)

Week 3

Brite Idea: Jesus chose to suffer for us.

He Question: Why did Jesus suffer?

Jesus took the punishment for the sins of the world. He was our sacrifice, and suffering and pain were part of that sacrifice. He was willing to suffer because of His love for people.

We Question: Does Jesus understand our suffering?

Jesus suffered and understands our pain too. Because He was fully human, He felt everything that happened to Him. We can trust that He understands how we feel.

## THIEF ON THE CROSS

(Luke 23:32-43)

Week 4

Brite Idea: Jesus makes salvation available to everyone.

He Question: Who does Jesus love?

Jesus loves everyone in the world, no matter what they have done or who they are.

We Question: Who can go to heaven?

-- Anyone who believes in Jesus and trusts in Him as Savior will have eternal life.

## RESURRECTION

(Matthew 28:1-10)

Week 5

Brite Idea: Jesus is alive!

He Question: How could Jesus be alive again?

Jesus was raised to life by the amazing power of God. He has all authority over life and death. Jesus' resurrection defeated death forever.

We Question: What does the resurrection mean for us?

·· Sin and death have been defeated, making a way for us to be forgiven by God's grace. Because Jesus is alive, we have hope in this life and for eternity.
