Genesis 17:1-27

DISCUSS

Read the Passage – Genesis 17:1-27

- What stood out to you the most from this passage?

Discuss & Apply the Passage

- God tells Abram to “walk before me and be blameless” (17:1). If someone were to closely observe your spiritual walk right now, what would they see consistently shaping your life?
- God changes Abram and Sarai's names as part of establishing a new identity rooted in His promise. How does the gospel reshape a person's identity today, and what old identities are hardest to let go of?
- Pastor Matthew shared “Our identity flows from God's promise, not from personal performance.” Where do you find yourself tempted to base your worth on achievement, approval, or success instead of God's promises?
- What repeated promises does God reaffirm to Abraham in verses 2-8? Why is repetition significant here?
- In verses 22-27 we see that Abraham obeyed “that very day”? What does immediate obedience reveal about genuine faith?
- Pastor Matthew said that our sin does not cancel God's promises. How have you personally experienced God remaining faithful even when you were faithless?
- Are there areas in your life where your outward actions do not fully reflect your inward relationship with God? How can integrity grow in those areas?
- How can surrounding yourself with godly community help you “walk before God and be blameless”?

Prayer Prompt (the Ask) – Father, what is my name?

Review the Task – Walk before God and be blameless.

- Looking back over this past week, how has God been moving in your life? What has God been trying to teach you?
